Manuscript Preparation and Submission:

- Please submit articles in a Word document with basic format. It is critical to check the spelling and accuracy of all medical terms as the copy editor may not have a medical background. Our copy editor follows the guidelines of the Associated Press Style Book. Please be aware of the following formatting guidelines while writing your contribution:
 - Word count is extremely important and should not exceed the limits noted above.
 - Sentences should be separated by single spaces, not double.
 - Place periods between a.m. and p.m. when referencing a time.
 - o Titles are only capitalized when they precede a person's name.
- All photos included in the article are subject to copyright laws.
- Video links need to be stored in the WDMS YouTube account.

Personal Details:

- Only your name should be listed at the beginning of your article including your credentials, i.e., John Smith, MD, RN.
- <u>Byline</u>: Your full byline should be at the end of the article with academic title(s) and affiliations as well as your contact information. For example, Emily Ferrara, MD at the beginning of the article and Emily Ferrara, MD, Assistant Professor of Family Medicine and Community Health, Director, grants, and special projects in the UMass Chan Medical School's Office of Medical Education. Email: <u>e.ferrara@umassmed.edu</u>.
- Headshot: Please include a professional headshot to accompany your article.

General guidelines for citing information:

- References should follow the APA formatting guidelines.
- Numbers following a citation in the body of the document should be enumerated as follows with square brackets: [1]. The references should then be listed at the end of the article.
- Citation numbers should appear in sequential order.
- There is no limit to the number of references in the article; all references will be accessible through a QR code from the TOC. We will create this.
- The editor and the copy editor, in conjunction with Worcester District Medical Society staff, write all headlines and photo captions for Worcester Medicine due to style and space considerations.

Worcester Medicine will edit all articles to make certain they are consistent with standard formatting and are easy to read. The copy editor may make changes to articles, especially in situations where articles are considered overly wordy, where a sense of editorial flow is missing or when the writer has exceeded the allotted word limit. Worcester Medicine reserves the right not to publish an article.

If the author is submitting a previously published article, the author must submit the publication site and approval that the article can be re-published.
